Senate Bill 151 Unconstitutional

The Supreme Court of Kentucky has affirmed the decision of the Franklin Circuit Court in the case of *Bevin V. Commonwealth of Kentucky* (Case No. 2018-SC-00419-TG and Case No. 2018-SC-000421-TG), declaring the 2018 pension reform bill, Senate Bill 151, void and of no effect as unconstitutional. KRS will continue to provide monthly retirement benefits based on current state laws. [Read more](#)

Did you know a first-time elected Mayor or City Council member with no prior CERS service, in a full-time position, can elect or reject participation in KRS? Please refer to [Kentucky Revised Statute 61.510\(21\)](#) for the definition of full-time position.

To elect or reject participation, a Form 2012 must be completed for each newly elected official who qualifies. Form 2012 is available in [Employer Self Service](#). Any elected official working less than 100 hours per month must be reported as Non-Participating Part-Time or Intermittent.
